

The Department of Student Life at the University of Evansville invites applications for a full-time, 10-month contracted appointment as a Disability Services Counselor in the Office of Counseling Services with a starting date of August 1, 2021 (August 1-May 31).

The Disability Services Counselor will be responsible for reviewing documentation and determining appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities that include psychiatric, cognitive, sensory, medical, physical, and temporary conditions. The professional will work closely with the Coordinator of Disability Services as well as faculty and other campus departments to ensure accommodations are provided. Additionally, the counselor will work with the coordinator to develop programming to educate the campus community regarding the needs of students with disabilities.

The Disability Services Counselor will join 3 other mental health counselors in a dynamic team setting to provide individual and group counseling to a diverse student population. The Counselor will make assessments for mental health topics that include adjustment issues, depression, anxiety, grief/loss, and substance abuse issues, as well as triage and evaluate mental health crises to provide short-term, goal-focused therapy. The counselor will participate with 3 other counselors for emergency on-call rotation.

Educational and credentialing requirements include MSW and LSW; LCSW preferred with a minimum of 1-year experience. Advanced clinical counseling skills are needed.
