ACCA OFFICER EXPECTATIONS IF ELECTED: During and throughout the elected term, each elected member of the ACCA Executive Council (EC) is expected to attend the annual ACCA Conference, the ACCA Executive Council Leadership Retreat (summer), and participate on scheduled EC conference calls. President-level positions are expected to participate in ACA duties, as assigned. Travel to these meetings is required and air travel is the expected norm unless alternative travel is deemed feasible (consult with the ACCA President in advance). Registration, travel, and lodging expenses are generally** reimbursed for required EC meetings and conferences (**costs saving practices limit some expenses). In addition to volunteering for projects as discussed by the EC, each elected position has assigned duties and it is expected that these duties are carried out.
