Kent State University seeks to fill two newly-funded psychologist positions to join our treatment team of health care providers at the Kent campus. University Health Services is dedicated to building a culturally diverse staff committed to serving a multicultural student population. Candidates with university counseling experience in the provision of crisis intervention, psychotherapy, outreach programming and consultation with a multi-cultural student population are preferred. Ideal candidates will have a doctorate in clinical or counseling psychology, hold an Ohio license or be license-eligible, demonstrate multicultural competency, and have experience with eating disorders, trauma and/or DBT. These are 39-week full-time positions that require flexible work hours, and salary is commensurate with experience and licensure status. Both experienced and early career psychologists are encouraged to apply.

University Health Services operates within the Division of Student Affairs, which includes as part of its mission the cultivation of an intentionally designed, inclusive and engaging student experience that promotes the intellectual, emotional, physical, and spiritual development of all students. The division's goal is one of a larger university-wide effort to promote health and wellness within eight key areas, mental health and substance use being two of those eight areas.

Kent State University is an eight-campus public institution with enrollment of 40,000 students from all 50 states and more than 100 countries. Rated a top national public university according to U.S. News and World Report, Kent State offers more than 200 undergraduate majors and minors, masters and doctoral degrees, and an accredited College of Podiatric Medicine.

With location in northeast Ohio, Kent State is easily accessible to many area attractions. The city of Cleveland offers the nation's largest concentration of cultural, educational and medical institutions within one square mile; the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame; Playhouse Square, containing 10 performance spaces; the 2016 American League Champion Cleveland Indians; and the 2016 NBA Champion Cleveland Cavaliers. Also within easy driving distance is the Cuyahoga Valley National Park and Scenic Railroad, covering 33,000 acres of woods, water and wildlife. All of these opportunities are offered within an affordable region with a cost of living well below the national average.
